

2022-23 WA STATE AVERAGES CALCULATIONS

PAXTON AVERAGES

The following applies to all State average calculation for the Paxton Averages for Men:-

- The Paxton Averages are open to all male amateur golfers resident in Western Australia with an Australian GA Handicap of 5.4 or less.
- To qualify for an average, a player must play a minimum of fifteen (15) rounds in Paxton events over a 12 month rolling period.
- Players withdrawing (without good reason) or that are disqualified from any round in a Paxton event will have a score of eighty six (86) recorded for that round (except in circumstances that are approved by GolfWA).
- Scores returned during an event where the Scratch Rating of the set of tees used is not 71 will be increased or decreased by the number of strokes that it is below or above 71.
- If an event is cancelled or not held in the designated period (noted below) like the rolling average all scores from the previous year will be deleted.
- Once a player has completed fifteen rounds the worst score of the player shall be excluded and thereafter one round for every fifteen played shall be excluded.
- The winner of the Paxton Averages will be the player who has the lowest adjusted average at the designated period being 1 August to 31 July inclusive.

IVIE TEMPERLEY AVERAGES

The following applies to all State average calculation for the Ivie Temperley Averages for Women:-

- The Ivie Temperley Averages are open to all female amateur golfers resident in Western Australia with an Australian GA Handicap of 12.1 or less.
- To qualify for an average, a player must play a minimum of fifteen (15) rounds in Ivie Temperley events over a 12 month rolling period.
- Players withdrawing (without good reason) or that are disqualified from any round in a Ivie Temperley event will have a score of eighty six (86) recorded for that round (except in circumstances that are approved by GolfWA).
- Scores returned during an event where the Scratch Rating of the set of tees used is not 71 will be increased or decreased by the number of strokes that it is below or above 71.
- If an event is cancelled or not held in the designated period (noted below) like the rolling average all scores from the previous year will be deleted.
- Once a player has completed fifteen rounds the worst score of the player shall be excluded and thereafter one round for every fifteen played shall be excluded.
- The winner of the Ivie Temperley Averages will be the player who has the lowest adjusted average at the designated time being 1 August to 31 July inclusive.

CRUNCH&SIP JUNIOR STROKE AVERAGES

The following applies to all State average calculation for Crunch&Sip Junior Stroke Averages which applies to all junior events in the period between the annually held Crunch& Sip Junior Presentation Day: -

- The Crunch&Sip Junior Stroke Averages are open to all male and female amateur golfers under the age of 18 as at the 1st January of the year of the award. Players must be residents of Western Australia and there is no minimum handicap requirement.
- To qualify for an average, a player must play a minimum of fifteen (15) rounds in Junior Stroke Average events over a 12-month rolling period. GolfWA reserves the right to reduce this minimum number of rounds for any age division if circumstances warrant this.
- Players withdrawing (without good reason) or that are disqualified from any junior event, a score of ninety-two (92) recorded for that round (except in circumstances that are approved by GolfWA).
- Scores returned during an event where the Scratch Rating of the set of tees used is not 71 will be increased or decreased by the number of strokes that it is below or above 71.
- If an event is cancelled or not held in the designated period (noted below) like the rolling average all scores from the previous year will be deleted.
- Once a player has completed fifteen (15) rounds the worst score of the player shall be excluded and thereafter one round for every fifteen (15) played shall be excluded.
- The winner of the Crunch&Sip Junior Averages in their respective age division will be the player who has returned the lowest adjusted score for the designated period as noted above.
