Introduction and Purpose

GolfWA is a major stakeholder in junior golf in Western Australia.

We aim to assist clubs in the development of young players through a variety of programs and events, ensuring that children can develop their golf in a safe and enjoyable environment, no matter their skill or competition level.

Research and observations around Australia and the world indicate that Junior Golfers need to be encouraged to develop independent thought processes and knowledge of the game. Competing without a caddie can be advantageous at certain stages of their golfing journey and assist with pace of play.

Keeping in alignment with Golf Australia and other State bodies, GolfWA has introduced a policy which does not permit a player in certain events to have a caddie. It's recommended that clubs consider adopting a similar position with their Junior Open events at a minimum.

Scope

This policy applies to Junior events managed by Golf WA unless specified otherwise.

Responsibility

The GolfWA Golf Operations Manager is responsible for overseeing the application of this policy and due process.

The GolfWA Golf Events Officer is responsible for ensuring compliance with the policy.

Definitions

Caddie – As defined by the Rules of Golf is someone who helps a player during a round, including in these ways (for junior events this is relevant for caddies for juniors under the age of 12 only):

- Carrying, Transporting or Handling Clubs: A person who carries, transports (such as by cart or trolley) or handles a player's clubs during play is the player's **caddie** even if not named as a **caddie** by the player, **except** when done to move the player's clubs, bag or cart out of the way or as a courtesy (such as getting a club the player left behind).
- Giving Advice: A player's **caddie** is the only person (other than a partner or partner's **caddie**) a player may ask for advice.

A **caddie** may also help the player in other ways allowed by the Rules (see [Rule 10.3b](#)).

Note 1: A person that carries or provides food and refreshment for a player, or assists in the search for golf balls, is not considered a caddie.

Note 2: Parents, guardians and interested persons are requested to stay at a discreet distance from the playing group unless absolutely required.

Policy

GolfWA acknowledges that at different stages of a Junior Golfers development, caddies can be of comfort and value, however as juniors progress towards competitive play we believe independent decision-making is an important part of their development. The decision to not permit the use of caddies in the following categories of events reflects this belief and has been in force since 1 Jan 2018.

GolfWA Junior Open Events - Caddies Not Permitted

Caddies will not be permitted in the following junior open events conducted by GolfWA with an exception for juniors **under the age of 12 at the date of the first day of the event**;

- Secondary School Teams Championship
- Primary School Teams Championship
- Cobra-Puma Junior Championships
- Drummond Golf 54 Hole Junior Championships
- Drummond Amateur Championship of WA
- Junior Presentation Day

It is a condition of entry in the above events that players are not permitted to use a caddie during a stipulated round.

GolfWA Junior Open Events - Caddies Permitted

- Boys and Girls Pennant Competitions (**except for juniors under the age of 12 at the date of the pennant round**).

Caddies are permitted for Boys and Girls Pennants **HOWEVER** the role of the caddie is restricted to the below:

- Transporting the players bag, and
- Assisting in caring for the course (e.g. raking bunkers, filling divots)

Caddies are not permitted on the green, and may not assist the player with shot alignment in these events. GolfWA endeavours to encourage players to become independent in their golf game and will allow caddies in these instances for the purpose of increasing speed of play and caring for the course.

Listed below are tasks/cues **CADDIES MAY NOT** assist with:

- i) Teeing the ball on the teeing ground.
- ii) Verbal cues while player is taking their shot.
- iii) Technique coaching on course.

Crunch & Sip GolfWA Junior Tour Events

As these events feed into the 18 hole events held by GolfWA it was felt that players should slowly be introduced to playing without a caddie.

i. Stableford – Caddies Not Permitted

It is a condition of entry in these events that players are not permitted to use a caddie during a stipulated round.

ii. Modified Stroke – Caddies Permitted

iii. Tiger Tees – Caddies Permitted

After considering the age, skill, and physical and emotional development of participants in these categories it was decided to continue to allow players in these divisions to have a caddie. It was felt that one on one interaction between player and caddie (most often a parent) was going to be more beneficial in the long-term development of the player both as a golfer and as a person at this stage in their golfing development.

Disclaimer

It is a condition of this policy that in unforeseen circumstances a committee in charge of a competition can alter this policy to allow a player to have a caddie in any of the above events.
